UBT utilizes a comprehensive Student Information System (Opera), which serves as a centralized platform for tracking and managing applications from a wide range of student demographics, including those from underrepresented or potentially underrepresented groups. This system allows UBT to monitor applications and admissions across various categories, including traditional male and female students, non-traditional and international candidates, students with disabilities, and other diverse groups.

Data Tracking and Reporting Capabilities

Opera's tracking and reporting tools provide robust support for analyzing application data, allowing UBT to measure application ratios and compare them to the total applicant pool. This information enables the university to assess recruitment strategies, analyze trends, and make data-driven adjustments to attract and support a diverse range of students. The system also includes detailed filtering options, allowing administrators to sort applicants by various criteria, such as gender, nationality, educational background, and disability status. These tailored reports help departments analyze trends, track student progress, and make decisions aligned with UBT's inclusivity goals.



Scholarship Office Support for Low-Income Students

In addition to Opera, UBT's Scholarship Office plays an essential role in supporting low-income students by maintaining detailed records of scholarship recipients. These reports include crucial details like students' names, nationalities, ID numbers, and specific scholarship types. Tracking the progress of low-income students throughout their academic journey allows UBT to measure success rates among this group, helping ensure that





students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds receive ongoing support(See evidence No.2)

UBT Education Support Center

UBT education support center closely tracks applications for students with disabilities, beginning at the admissions stage and continuing throughout their time at the university. This center maintains detailed records to ensure that students with disabilities are provided with appropriate resources and accommodation from the start of their academic journey. By monitoring these applications, the Education Support Center can anticipate and address specific needs early on, ensuring that these students receive consistent support tailored to their requirements
